This talk is part of a collaborative project exploring Aboriginal history, culture, stories, and place names on Dyarubbin, the Hawkesbury River. The Archbishop of Melbourne has appointed the Rev'd Dr Aaron Ghiloni as the 17th Vicar of St John's Camberwell in Melbourne. His

service on institution will be on the evening of Tuesday 4th February 2025. Fr Aaron has been serving as Assistant Curate at St George's Malvern and as Hospital Chaplain at Cabrini Malvern. AID Vanuatu Earthquake Appeal

High rainfall, aftershocks and the threat of cyclones continue to challenge recovery efforts in Vanuatu following the earthquakes in December. The UN reports that 2,435 people remain displaced from their homes. Key immediate needs include healthcare support, emergency shelter, access to food and water, protection, psychological support and the restoration of communication networks. The Anglican Church of Melanesia (ACOM) ship, MV Southern Cross has arrived at Port Vila on Efate Island with supplies. In addition to supplies purchased with the support of Anglicans in Development (AID) ACOM is receiving supplies from locals on Santo Island, many of whom have friends and family on Efate Island. Early Rabbinic Interpretation of the Bible

Trinity College Melbourne are offering a 12-week unit of study taught by Dr Simon Holloway on the world of early Jewish exegesis and the role of the Hebrew Bible in early rabbinic Judaism. Simon will introduce the class to the important collections of rabbinic texts (Mishna and Talmud) and explore the origins of rabbinic exegesis; how biblical passages were recontextualized, disambiguated and elaborated upon, and how the biblical corpus as a whole was mined for material of an ethical or legal nature. This unit is ideal for anyone interested in Jewish interpretations of the Bible and provides an indispensable foundation for current or future researchers in the Hebrew Bible or in New Testament studies. The class is taught entirely online during Semester 1 on Tuesday evenings from 7pm-9pm commencing 25th February. Students can take this subject for academic credit through the University of Divinity, or as an audit student. Audit price \$550 per student.
