Former St James' parishioner Jim Arcus died peacefully on Friday 3rd January ages 87. Jim and Sue (deceased) and their children were active members of the parish from the 1970s to the 1990s. Jim's funeral was held at St Brendan's Catholic Church in Shepparton last Tuesday.

✤ Bishop Keith Rayner AO 1929-2025

The former Archbishop of Melbourne Keith Rayner died peacefully on the 12th January 2025, almost eight weeks after his 95th birthday. Bishop Keith was ordained in the Brisbane diocese in 1953 and went on to serve as Bishop of Wangaratta, Archbishop of Adelaide, Archbishop of Melbourne, and Primate of the Anglican Church of Australia. Funeral details are yet to be finalised, and will be announced in due course.
