Our regular Wednesday lunchtime concert series takes a break during January. The lunchtime concerts and Wednesday Choral Evensongs resume on Wednesday 5th February 2025.

Vanuatu Earthquake Appeal

Earthquakes continue to rock Vanuatu with the most recent quake (magnitude 4.9) on Christmas Day. The first earthquake was the strongest (magnitude 7.3), striking Vanuatu's capital city, Port Vila, on 17th December. Further earthquakes have followed almost every day. Communities and government authorities are working to restore water supplies, electricity services, bridges and communications systems on the worst hit Island, Efate, while also treating the injured and searching for missing people. The Anglican Church of Melanesia has been distributing food and water to affected families on Efate Island as well as providing psychological and pastoral support. The Anglican Board of Mission (ABM) and Anglicans in Development (AID) has already sent \$15,000 from their rapid response funds to support the Anglican Church of Melanesia and have launched an Emergency Appeal. Early Rabbinic Interpretation of the Bible

Trinity College Melbourne are offering a 12-week unit of study taught by Dr Simon Holloway on the world of early Jewish exegesis and the role of the Hebrew Bible in early rabbinic Judaism. Simon will introduce the class to the important collections of rabbinic texts (Mishna and Talmud) and explore the origins of rabbinic exegesis; how biblical passages were recontextualized, disambiguated and elaborated upon, and how the biblical corpus as a whole was mined for material of an ethical or legal nature. This unit is ideal for anyone interested in Jewish interpretations of the Bible and provides an indispensable foundation for current or future researchers in the Hebrew Bible or in New Testament studies. The class is taught entirely online during Semester 1 on Tuesday evenings from 7pm-9pm commencing 25th February. Students can take this subject for academic credit through the University of Divinity, or as an audit student. Audit price \$550 per student.
