The choir sings the Psalm to a chant by Thalben-Ball:

Put me not to rebuke, O Lord, in thine anger :

neither chasten me in thy heavy displeasure.

For thine arrows stick fast in me:

and thy hand presseth me sore.

There is no health in my flesh, because of thy displeasure:

neither is there any rest in my bones, by reason of my sin.

For my wickednesses are gone over my head:

and are like a sore burden, too heavy for me to bear.

My wounds stink, and are corrupt:

through my foolishness.

I am brought into so great trouble and misery:

that I go mourning all the day long.

For my loins are filled with a sore disease:

and there is no whole part in my body.

I am feeble, and sore smitten:

I have roared for the very disquietness of my heart.

Lord, thou knowest all my desire :

and my groaning is not hid from thee.

My heart panteth, my strength hath failed me:

and the sight of mine eyes is gone from me.

My lovers and my neighbours did stand looking upon my trouble :

and my kinsmen stood afar off.

They also that sought after my life laid snares for me:

and they that went about to do me evil talked of wickedness, and imagined deceit all the day long.

As for me, I was like a deaf man, and heard not:

and as one that is dumb, who doth not open his mouth.

I became even as a man that heareth not:

and in whose mouth are no reproofs.

For in thee, O Lord, have I put my trust:

thou shalt answer for me, O Lord my God.

I have required that they, even mine enemies, should not triumph over me : for when my foot slipped, they rejoiced greatly against me.

And I, truly, am set in the plague:

and my heaviness is ever in my sight.

For I will confess my wickedness:

and be sorry for my sin.

But mine enemies live, and are mighty:

and they that hate me wrongfully are many in number.

They also that reward evil for good are against me:

because I follow the thing that good is.

Forsake me not, O Lord my God:

be not thou far from me.

Haste thee to help me:

O Lord God of my salvation. Gloria Patri...
