Choral Evensong to Commemorate Ruth Cracknell

At Choral Evensong on Sunday 6th July at 4pm we will celebrate and commemorate the late Ruth Cracknell, Australian actress, comedian and author. Ruth had a life-long connection with St James' King Street; she married Eric Phillips here in 1957 and regularly participated in services, in particular reading at Nine Lessons and Carols. When Ruth died in 2002 her funeral was held here at St James' and her ashes are interred in the Columbarium. Sunday 6th July this year marks the 100th anniversary of her birth. Everyone is welcome to Choral Evensong that afternoon as we come together in prayer and thanksgiving, and to remember Ruth's significant contribution to the life of our parish and her role as a leading figure in the arts community in Australia.
