Anstey Psalter

St James' King Street is taking part in a trial of a new translation of the Psalter for liturgical use, commissioned by the General Synod of the Anglican Church of Australia. The Psalter is the work of priest and scholar The Rev'd Associate Professor Matthew Anstey, an internationally recognised Hebrew scholar and lecturer. Matthew was Principal of St Barnabas College, Adelaide (2010-2017) and has been the parish priest at St Theodore's, Toorak Gardens, Adelaide, since September 2022. The Anstey Psalter project seeks to produce a modern and accurate translation of the Book of Psalms, which is accessible, contemporary, poetic and musical, and suitable for all forms of liturgical and private devotion, drawing upon the latest psalms scholarship. The project is assisted by an Advisory Committee: Clive Rodgers (chair), Rt Rev'd Dr Richard Treloar, Rt Rev'd Prof Stephen Pickard, Very Rev'd Chris Chataway, Rev'd Dr Jane Foulcher, Rev'd Canon Stephen Daughtry, Kathy Teague, Jan Andrews, and former St James' chorister Richard Black.
