A silence for reflection follows the sermon.

The Presentation

The baptism and confirmation candidates and their sponsors move to the chancel steps.

Bishop We welcome those who have come to be baptised.

I invite their sponsors to present them now.

The sponsors answer in turn

Sponsor I present N to be baptised.

The bishop invites the sponsors of confirmation candidates to present the candidates.

Bishop We welcome those who have come to be confirmed.

I invite their sponsors to present them now.

The sponsors answer in turn

Sponsor I present N who comes to be confirmed.

The Decision

The bishop says to the candidates

Bishop Before God and this congregation, you must affirm that you turn to

Christ and reject all that is evil:

Do you turn to Christ?

Answer I turn to Christ.

Do you repent of your sins?

I repent of my sins.

Do you reject selfish living, and all that is false and unjust?

I reject them all.

Do you renounce Satan and all evil?

I renounce all that is evil.

Almighty God deliver you from the powers of darkness, and lead you in the light of Christ to his everlasting kingdom. **Amen.**

The bishop says to the candidates

Will you each, by God's grace, strive to live as a disciple of Christ, loving God with your whole heart, and your neighbour as yourself, until your life's end?

I will, with God's help.

The bishop says to the congregation

Bishop You have heard these our brothers and sisters respond to Christ.

Will you support them in this calling?

All We will.

The bishop prays for the candidates to be baptised

Bishop Let us pray.

Grant, merciful God, that *N* may be so buried with Christ in baptism that the new nature may be raised up in them. May the fruit of your Spirit grow and flourish in them. **Amen.**

Give to their sponsors, friends and family the desire to share with them what you have revealed in your holy gospel. **Amen.**

May they know Christ's forgiving love and continue in the fellowship and service of his Church. May they proclaim, by word and example, the good news of God in Christ. **Amen.**

We thank you for the ministry we have in your world and to each other in the household of faith. Hasten that day when the whole creation shall be made perfect in Christ. **Amen.**

The candidates being baptised, along with their supporters, process to the font.

We give you thanks for your Son Jesus Christ: for his baptism by John, for his anointing with the Holy Spirit.

We give you thanks that through the deep waters of death Jesus delivered us from our sins and was raised to new life in triumph.

Thanks be to God.

We give you thanks for the grace of the Holy Spirit who forms us in the likeness of Christ and leads us to proclaim your kingdom.

Thanks be to God.

And now we give you thanks that you have called *N* to new birth in your Church through the waters of baptism. Pour out your Holy Spirit in blessing and sanctify this water so that those who are to be baptised in it may be made one with Christ in his death and resurrection. May they die to sin, rise to newness of life, and continue forever in Jesus Christ our Lord, through whom we give you praise and honour in the unity of the Spirit, now and for ever. **Amen.**

Bishop I now ask you to affirm as yours the faith of the Church.

Do you believe in God the Father?

Answer I believe in God, the Father almighty,

creator of heaven and earth.

Do you believe in God the Son?

I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead.

On the third day he rose from the dead; he ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father; from there he will come to judge the living and the dead.

Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit? I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

This is the faith of the Church.

This is our faith:
We believe in one God:
Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

The candidates are brought to the water.

N I baptise you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Bishop N, I sign you with the sign of the cross to show that you are marked

as Christ's own for ever.

Live as a disciple of Christ: fight the good fight,

finish the race, keep the faith.

All Confess Christ crucified,

proclaim his resurrection,

look for his coming in glory.

Presentation of the candle

The candidates are each given a baptismal candle lit from the paschal candle

Bishop N, God has brought you out of darkness

into his marvellous light.

All Shine as a light in the world

to the glory of God the Father.

God has called you into his Church.

We therefore receive and welcome you as a member with us of the body of Christ, as a child of the one heavenly Father, and as an inheritor of the kingdom of God.

The candidates return to the Chancel steps with the Bishop while the organist improvises. Then follows the hymn with the congregation kneeling (or sitting) and the confirmation candidates standing:

Jesus Christ our Lord.

Anglican Church of Australia and accept her doctrine and order?

Answer I do.

The bishop welcomes Viktoria in these words, taking her by the hand -

We recognise you as a baptised and communicant member of the Christian Church.

Viktoria kneels before the bishop and he lays his hands on her head, saying
